DOWNTOWN'S HOUSING: LIMITED SUPPLY, STEADY DEMAND

*H*ave you ever scanned the lights in condos at night and wondered how they're faring in this market? Well, the answer is—remarkably resilient.

Results from the DDA's second quarter survey of the downtown residential market showed buyers have purchased all but 173 of the original condos built during the recent boom. As of June, just 11 percent of all Downtown Fort Lauderdale's condos were available for sale, whereas Miami has a daunting 40% available.

Downtown Fort Lauderdale's new rental buildings have also been well received, and the older Camden Las Olas has maintained 90% occupancy during the recession. Already, 440 Flagler was 61 percent occupied, and Alexan Solmar had leased almost half of its apartments.

While short-term supply is relatively balanced, how will the housing crisis shape Downtown's future? DDA Board Member Alan Hooper, president of Hooper Development, points out, "Quality downtowns evolve, and that process happens over time—they're not built in a five—to

10-year boom. And when the economy recovers, demand for housing will come. People want to live close to Downtowns—we're already seeing young people who have left suburban areas, wanting to live close to Las Olas, Himmarshee and the beach."

"You make lemonade out of lemons. Our 'lemonade' is that we will recover fairly fast," Hooper continues. "Smart development is a response to need," he notes, "and need will produce shops and restaurants on Andrews and Third Avenues, creating neighborhoods where people want to live. Once those neighborhood uses are in place, the demand for housing will return".

City Commissioner's Message

District IV Commissioner

After much analysis and debate, we have our budget for 2009/2010. I would like to thank all of you who attended the Budget Hearings and brought to the forefront, the human experience and impact of a down economy. It is important that we, Commission and management, hear you and address your concerns. This is just the first step in "tightening our belts". For this fiscal year, we have managed to maintain a millage rate of 4.1193 for all general city purposes. This is the same millage rate as last year and it represents a 10.46% decrease in the millage rate under the rolled-back rate of 4.5995 mills.

Needless to say, funding is vitally important at this time. You can help protect federal funding for our city's social services, community development block grants and other grant programs essential to our communities. Please, make sure you, your friends and neighbors are all counted in the 2010 Census. For each person not counted, there is a loss of \$1,268 of federal funding per year. In the 2000 Census, Broward County had an estimated undercount of nearly 20,000 people. One possible deterrent for some may be misunderstanding about how census data is used. Be assured that any identifiable information remains confidential for no less than 72 years and cannot be shared with anyone, including code enforcement, welfare or immigration agencies. The 2010 Census has made it even easier for you to be counted by simplifying the forms, now only requiring a few minutes of your time. Remember, the results of this data are also used to allocate Congressional seats (congressional apportionment) and electoral votes. The census is just another means of participating in your government.

In some neighborhood news...The Harbordale and adjoining neighborhood of Poinciana Park had a very successful Crime Walk on Friday September 25th. Our police chief, Frank Adderley (along with the horse, bike and motorcycle patrols) joined Vice Mayor Bruce Roberts, a large group of neighborhood folks and myself on a walk through the South Miami Road area to emphasize the solidarity of the neighborhood and police department's efforts against crime. Thanks to everyone involved, including the CVC (Citizens Volunteer Corp) who adopted this effort as one of their many community activities.

What IS and ISN'T Recyclable?

Remember a few months ago I wrote about the items that are recyclable for our blue bins? Just because a container has a number, doesn't automatically mean it's recyclable in our area.

To the average person, plastic is plastic. "We can tell the difference between glass and aluminum, but not the difference between a high-density polyethylene and polyvinyl chloride," says Betty McLaughlin, executive director of the Container Recycling Institute. So in 1988 the Society of Plastics Industry classified the different types of plastics into seven groups and assigned a number so consumers could more easily differentiate them for recycling.

Hopefully, in the future, Fort Lauderdale will be able to include all the numbers found on the bottom of all plastic materials. Until then it is still plastic bottles, (neck narrower than body) such as soda bottle, milk, water, detergent and shampoo bottles **WITHOUT CAPS OR LIDS**. For the latest information on what to recycle and what is coming in the future for recycling in Fort Lauderdale, go to www.fortlauderdale.gov/recycle.

I thought it would be interesting and helpful for you to know what all those numbers on the bottoms of plastic containers *really* mean:

#1 Poly Terephthalate (PET or PETE)

Clear and tough, the most commonly recycled plastic
Original uses: Soft drink & water bottles, plastic food jars
Recycled Uses: Carpets, fleece jackets, food and drink containers

#2 High-Density Polyethylene (HDPE)

Good chemical resistance
Original Uses: Detergent & bleach bottles, milk bottles, shampoo bottles, grocery bags, cereal box liners
Recycled Uses: Nonfood containers, (household cleaners & motor oil, outdoor decking, recycling bins

#3 Polyvinyl Chloride (PVC)

Suitable for flexible & rigid packaging
Original Uses: Shrink-wrap, siding, window frames, medical tubing
Recycled Uses: Pipe, decking, gutters, mud flaps

#4 Low-Density Polyethylene (LDPE)

Tough, transparent and flexible
Original Uses: Newspaper bags, dry cleaning bags, produce & bread bags, shrink-wrap, toys
Recycled Uses: Shipping envelopes, furniture, trash cans



#5 Polypropylene (PP)

High melting point that makes it ideal for packaging hot-fill liquids
Original Uses: Takeout meals, yogurt, deli foods, medicine bottles, bottle caps & closures
Recycled Uses: Garden rakes, storage bins, ice scrapers, oil funnels

#6 Polystyrene (PS)

Often called Styrofoam
Original Uses: Egg cartons, hot beverage cups, packing peanuts, plates, packaging for furniture & electronics
Recycled Uses: Egg cartons, thermal insulation, protective packaging for furniture & electronics

#7 Other

Description: Made with plastic resin other than the six above or with a combination of two or more resins
Original Uses: 3 and 5 gallon reusable water bottles, oven baking bags
Recycled Uses: Bottles, plastic lumber

One more important date to add to your calendar is Saturday, October 24, 2009, which is the **International Day of Climate Change**. It will take place *globally*, and to participate *locally*, be at the Museum of Discovery & Science at 10AM. There are lots of events for kids! 2009/2010 HOLIDAY SANITATION SERVICES SCHEDULE

THANKSGIVING DAY

There will be no changes to any City of Fort Lauderdale sanitation services, (e.g., garbage, bulk trash, yard waste and recycling collection) for Thanksgiving Day, Thursday, November 26, 2009.

CHRISTMAS DAY

Garbage - There will be no garbage collection on Christmas Day, Friday, December 25. Garbage collection for residents whose regular pickup schedule is Friday will receive service on Tuesday, December 29, 2009.

Bulk Trash Pick Up - There will be no Bulk Trash collection on Christmas Day, Friday, December 25. Bulk trash collection for residents whose regular pickup schedule is the fourth Friday of the month will receive service on Tuesday, December 29, 2009.

Yard Waste Collections - There will be no yard waste collection on Christmas Day, Friday, December 25. Yard waste collection service will resume on the next regularly scheduled pick up date, which is Friday, January 1, 2010.

Recycling - There will be no recycling collection on Christmas Day, Friday, December 25. Recycling service will resume on the next regularly scheduled pick up date, which is Friday, January 1, 2010.

The Garden Spot

COLOR IN THE GARDEN

By Sandy Keyzers, Holland Garden Center

October brings the first hint of cooler air and signals the beginning of the planting season here in South Florida. Vegetables to start now include collards, beans, lettuce, onions, peppers and tomatoes along with herbs and strawberries.

Container growing is an effective way to combat insects, regulate drainage and control weeds. Always use a high quality potting soil such as Fertilome. It contains a peat moss and other ingredients so necessary to retain moisture. Water your plants when signs of wilting appear and fertilize with an all purpose 20/20/20 or Fertilome's Blooming and Rooting.

Color in the garden with begonias (partial to shade and drier conditions), geraniums (good in full sun, excellent in pots) and impatiens (vibrant show of color ,requires frequent watering). Other choices include alyssum, coleus, dusty miller, marigolds, pansies, petunias, salvias, snapdragon, verbena and zinnias.

This is an important month to fertilize . We recommend Fertilome's Tree and Shrub on all your trees and shrubs, and it is also excellent for palm trees. We also recommend Fertilome's 16/4/8 for lawns. Lightly mulch outside gardens to help prevent weed and growth and conserve water as our dry season begins in mid October and lasts through the end of May.

Inspect your sprinkler system for any blown heads or pipe leaks. Trim back overgrown shrubbery if it blocks coverage. Insect problems will decrease with the coming of cooler weather, but still be sure to check weekly for signs of infestations. If spraying is necessary, try to use an organic product. 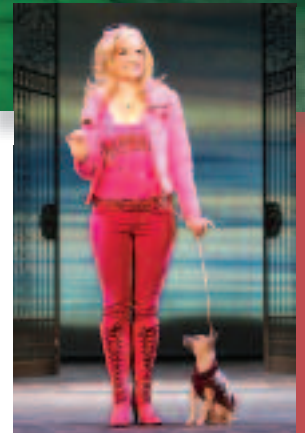
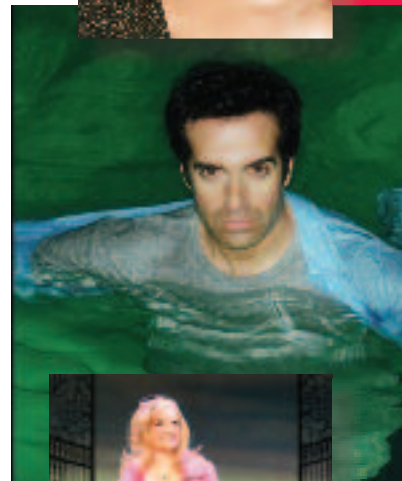
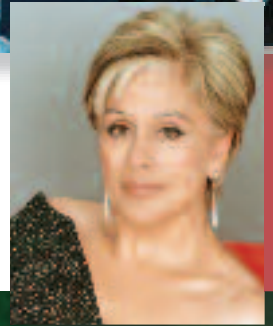
